SBCC Academic Majors

- **Over 80 different academic majors** from Art to Business, Communication, Engineering, Game Design and Psychology to name a few. Most students who do this path take classes at SBCC for 2 years and then transfer to a 4 year university.

The SBCC Promise will provide any local student who completes their secondary education within the Santa Barbara Community College District with the opportunity to attend SBCC full-time for two years free of charge. The Promise, a project of the SBCC Foundation, will use privately raised funds to cover all enrollment and required fees, required books, and required supplies in an effort to remove economic barriers, making our community's college fully accessible to all local students.

To be eligible for the SBCC Promise, a student must:

1. Complete secondary education or reside within the Santa Barbara Community College District.
2. Submit the completed California College Promise Grant (CCPG) (formerly Board of Governors (BOGW) Fee Waiver Application).
3. **Enroll at SBCC in either the fall or spring term directly out of high school.** (Fall 2021 or Spring 2022)
4. Commit to a full time student schedule throughout the duration of the SBCC Promise for each fall and spring semester.
5. Complete a Student Educational Plan (SEP).
6. Participate in academic counseling (at least one session per semester).
7. Remain in good academic standing at SBCC.



TAG: Transfer Admission Guarantee

- Contractual agreement between you, SBCC, and a four-year college or university.
- Students who meet and maintain stated admission and major requirements are **guaranteed** admission to a specific four-year college or university.

Guaranteed Admission is more commonly referred to as the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG). A TAG is a contractual agreement between you, SBCC, and a four-year college or university. Students who meet and maintain the conditions of the TAG will be guaranteed admission to the institution.

Honors Program

- Priority admission consideration to Universities
- Scholarship opportunities at SBCC
- Rigorous academics
- Strong preparation for transfer

- Must have an overall unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 with no grade below a “C” in an academic subject & eligible English 110 and Math 107
- Submit Honors Program Application: Accepted year around

IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum)

- **Pattern of courses that California community college students can follow to satisfy lower division general education requirements prior to transferring to a 4 year university**
- Satisfies general education for UC and CSU
- Students should meet with an academic counselor and visit <http://www.sbccc.edu/transfercenter/whichge.php> to determine the appropriate general education option for their transfer goal
- Completion of IGETC qualifies students to receive a Certificate of Achievement
