Santa Barbara City College Promise

The SBCC Promise will provide any local student who completes their secondary education within the Santa Barbara Community College District with the opportunity to attend SBCC full-time for two years free of charge. The Promise, a project of the SBCC Foundation, will use privately raised funds to cover all enrollment and required fees, required books, and required supplies in an effort to remove economic barriers, making our community's college fully accessible to all local students.

To be eligible for the SBCC Promise, a student must:

- Complete secondary education or reside within the Santa Barbara Community College District.
- Submit the completed FAFSA or California Dream Act.
- Enroll at SBCC in either the fall or spring term directly out of high school.
- Commit to a full time student schedule throughout the duration of the SBCC Promise for each fall and spring semester.
- Complete a Student Educational Plan (SEP).
- Participate in academic counseling (at least one session per semester).
- Remain in good academic standing at SBCC.

Financial Aid Support

We recommend that ALL Seniors planning to attend a college or university after graduation complete the FAFSA or the California Dream Act (CADAA). These applications are required for many scholarship opportunities, are required to receive the SBCC Promise, and required to be eligible for any Federal or State financial aid.

Which application do I complete?

- You would complete the FAFSA if . . . you are a US Citizen, Permanent Resident, or a Visa Holder
- You would complete the Dream Act if . . . you are undocumented, with or without DACA, TPS Status, U Visa Holders & AB540 eligible - email Mrs. Castelo at <u>ccastelo@sbunified.org</u> to schedule a one on one appointment to complete the CA Dream Act

These applications open on **October 1** and close on **March 2**. It is HIGHLY recommended you complete these before the winter holidays. Completing early makes you eligible for the most amount of aid.

Q: What activities were you involved in at SBHS?

A: I was in VADA, sports (track & field, swim team, dive team),



Q: What is your current school situation? Graduated from college, current student, Transfer, etc. Current Major if still in school?

A: I graduated from Cornell University in 2016 with a Bachelor of Fine Arts. This year, I took Ceramics at the SBCC Schott Center in the spring, and 4 Leadership & Business Development courses through SBCC's Career Technical Institute. All of these classes were free and SO helpful and fun. I just started pursuing an associates degree in Environmental Horticulture from SBCC. Currently taking Intro to Horticulture and Permaculture Design-I LOVE IT! I was Executive Director of a local nonprofit for 4 years and now manage the Grant Programs at a local family foundation.

Q: What surprised you about the first semester/quarter of college?

A: A lot surprised me about my first semester/quarter of college, but I know life and the world is both SO different than it was in 2012 and also the same. I can't exactly remember what I was surprised by, but I was constantly surprised by classmates, dorm mates, professors, mentors, family...College brings an ENTIRELY new dynamic and new era, and is unlike anything I had experienced at that time. It's liberating and daunting, exciting and challenging.

Q: What advice would you give current high school students regarding the college exploration or application process?

A: I would reassure high school students that no matter what you study in undergrad, it will be SO useful your whole life.
